Lesson 5: The Word of God

“What is the Significance of the Bible in My Life?”

What separates Christianity from any “religion” in the world is its claim to an absolute written authority from God. Having the Word of God is essential to a Christian’s growth in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ. The standard by which a Christian is to govern his life in every detail are found in the pages of the Word of God.

The purpose of this lesson is to acquaint the new Christian with the basics of the Bible and how to understand how its principles are to guide every facet of his walk with Jesus Christ.

Read this quote concerning the Bible:

“The bible contains the mind of God, the state of man, the way of salvation, the doom of sinners, and the happiness of believers. Its doctrines are holy, its precepts are binding, its histories are true, and its decisions are immutable.

Read it to be wise, believe it to be safe, and practice it to be holy. It contains light to direct you, food to support you, and comfort to cheer you. It is the traveler’s map, the pilgrim’s staff, the pilot’s compass, the soldier’s sword, and the Christian’s charter.

Here paradise is restored, heaven opened, and the gates of hell disclosed. Christ is its grand subject, our good, its design, and the glory of God, its end. It should fill the memory, rule the heart, and guide the feet.

Read it slowly, frequently, and prayerfully. It is a mine of wealth, a paradise of glory, and a river or pleasure. It is given to you in life, will be open at the judgment, and be remembered forever.

It involves the highest responsibility, rewards the greatest labor, and condemns all who trifle with its holy contents.”

A Brief History of the Bible.

The bible was written over 3,000 years ago. It consists of 66 books, 39 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. It has many writers for the individual books, but only one author, the Holy Spirit. (II Peter 1:21) It is infallible in its history, prophecy, and the future of man. It is a living word useful for instruction. (II Timothy 3:16-17)

How do I Learn God's Word?

The Holy Spirit of God will lead and guide you into all truth. God may use other instruments to aid in teaching (books, tapes, preachers, etc.) But, ultimately, truth is revealed by the Holy Spirit. See John 14:26 and John 16:13-15.

The Bible is learned by comparing scripture with scripture, relying on God's Spirit to teach you and not your own natural intellect. See 1 Corinthians 2:9-16.

There will be an immediate increase in personal testing, often from those closest to you who do not understand salvation or from other Christians who have lost their first love. "Blessed

are ye when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you.” Luke 6:22, “Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.” II Timothy 3:12

5. LOVE FOR OTHER CHRISTIANS

There will be a sincere enjoyment in the fellowship of other Christians. “Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another.” 1 John 4:7-13

It is essential that every Christian become an active member of a local church. This church must be true to the Word of God and active in proclaiming the Gospel to others who have not yet heard it.

6. DESIRE TO TELL OTHERS ABOUT CHRIST

One of the first signs of a genuine born-again Christian is that he will want to share his experience with others. It is important to provide opportunities for him to tell others who will encourage him rather than discourage him. “Let the redeemed of the Lord say so...” Psalm 107:2 “...be ready always to give an answer to every man that asks you a reason of the hope that is in you...” 1 Peter 3:15
